A Word from the Pastor ~

*And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice and yielded up his spirit.
(Matt. 27:50)*

Every moment of time from the beginning of creation until the end of time itself coalesces on this one point in history. All of history focuses on this one death. Heaven and earth meet at this solitary point where the Son of God hangs suspended between them. He hangs there on the cross bearing both the burdens of this sinful world and the holiness of heaven.

The shock waves that resulted from this meeting of heaven and earth were felt immediately—

And behold, the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. And the earth shook, and the rocks were split. The tombs also were opened. And many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised, and coming out of the tombs after his resurrection they went into the holy city and appeared to many. When the centurion and those who were with him, keeping watch over Jesus, saw the earthquake and what took place, they were filled with awe and said, "Truly this was the Son of God!" (Matt. 27:51-54)

These shock waves continue to reverberate today. Soon the Church will be observing the anniversary of this event on Good Friday. There is no escaping the impact of this day, for whether we confess it or not, we are responsible for the death of the Son of God. It was to pay for the sins of all humanity that He died on that cross. There is no washing our hands of it as Pilate attempted to do.

We are guilty. And whether or not we confess our guilt we will all stand one day, on that day when time comes to an end, and find that everything depends upon the day when Jesus yielded up His spirit. Those who have confessed their guilt and

and believed in the death of God's Son as the payment for their sins will be received into the eternal holiness of heaven. Those who have kept the burden of their sins for themselves will bear that burden forever in the tortures of hell.

The sinful world and the holiness of heaven met that Friday on the cross. You were brought to that fateful meeting place on the day of your Baptism. There your sinfulness met the holiness of the Son of God. In that meeting your world was shaken and your tomb was opened. The division between heaven and earth was torn in two and you were given the good confession—

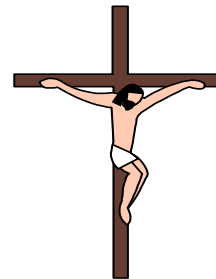
I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person..."

Because of that moment, that moment in time when sin and holiness met, we are prepared to reclaim our voices of praise on Easter morning when the term "Alleluia" will return to our vocabulary. We will stand at the empty tomb, His tomb and ours, and sing—

*Jesus Christ is ris'n today, Alleluia!
Our triumphant holy day, Alleluia!
Who did once upon the cross, Alleluia!
Suffer to redeem our loss. Alleluia!*

In the name of the One who yielded up His spirit for you. Amen.

From the Parish Nurse ~

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, April is Stress Awareness month. There are many ways to overcome the stress in our lives. Here are a few suggestions:

1. **Meditate on God's Word.** Now is the time to start your devotional life if you have been neglecting to do so. We all remember memorizing bible verses as a child but what about as an adult? Print meaningful bible verses on cards and place them around your home or carry them with you. Matthew 6:25- 34, Philippians 4:8-13, Psalms 23 and 130 can help provide some answers for you.
2. **Keep a "Biblical Journey" journal.** Write down your thoughts as read His Word. What a wonderful legacy to leave for your children, grandchildren, or someone special in your life.
3. **Talk to someone.** Create a support system. God listens too.
4. **Take time to care for yourself.** Take some leisure time for a long bath, reading a book, listening to music, or doing something you enjoy. Jesus took time away from the crowds to rest and pray.
5. **Watch your caffeine intake.** Caffeine is a stimulant that can stress the body.
6. **Get regular exercise.** According to the Mayo Clinic, any form of exercise can be beneficial. Consider walking, doing lawn work, dancing, working in a vegetable or flower garden, even housework to music.
7. **Get adequate sleep.** Experts say we need 7 to 9 hours of sleep each night.
8. **Laugh.** Laughter improves circulation, stimulates the immune system and nervous system, and reduces stress hormones. The face shows fewer lines and wrinkles when we smile than when we frown.
9. **Pray for guidance.** Have a realistic outlook of your life. Learn to ask for help and delegate responsibilities, prioritize tasks, and be willing to compromise.

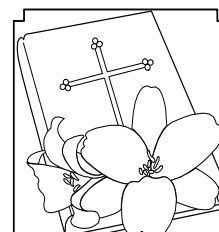

Freedom of Choice?

Abortion offers neither freedom or choice

(below are excerpts from this article which appeared in Lutheran's for Life Life Date - Winter 2008)

"Be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, holding fast to the word of life." Philippians 2:15-16a

Christians today live in a post-truth era. There are no longer falsehoods—or what we used to call lies—only "misspeaks" or "strategic misrepresentations." Absolute truth is unknowable and irrelevant (so they say) and truth is a personal matter and morals based on truth are not to be imposed on anyone. Surely we live in the midst of a "crooked and twisted generation." Words and phrases completely misrepresent reality. For example, the euphemism for abortion, "Freedom of Choice" has nothing to do with freedom or choice. Rather, the phrase is used to sugar coat what most people find unacceptable: the killing of an unborn baby.

We must "shine as lights" and expose the deeds of darkness by applying the TRUTH of God's Word to abortion and other life issues.

Christians must proclaim that:

- Abortion destroys an unborn child who has value through being created by God and a person for whom Christ died.
- Abortion is an act that God forbids.
- Abortion is a spiritual issue and, like all sin, separates people from their God.
- Abortion hurts women, men, grandparents, and everyone affected by that decision.

Christians must reach out to the casualties of our culture that bought the lies of perverted truth. We must reach out to:

- Women in unplanned pregnancies with compassion rather than judgment; encouraging them with truth and practical help.
- Women and men who participated in an abortion with the Good News that God forgives all confessed sin, even the sin of abortion.
