A Word from the Pastor ~

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

For this reason, because I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers, that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him, having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, according to the working of his great might that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come. And he put all things under his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all. (Ephes. 1:15-23 ESV)

As I write this newsletter, I have just finished preaching at the second funeral in a week of two beloved saints in Christ who died. Selma and Irma both died confessing Christ their Lord and God unto death. What a witness they were for family, members, medical staff, and all who knew them. In their deaths they both committed themselves into Christ's nail-pierced hands trusting His Easter victory over the grave. Even though they have died, yet do they live with the Triune God who created, redeemed, and sanctified them.

May their example be an encouragement to you in your Christian life. It is easy for the events of our times and the circumstances of life to get us down. Yet in the midst of all these signs of death is the victorious risen Christ who also is ascended such that He controls all things. At the same time He is with you,

and He works all things for your good. There is no detail in your life that He doesn't care about. Remember, as He has been Selma's and Irma's Lord and God in death, so He is your Lord and God in life. He will not fail you nor abandon you.

Later this month (Thursday 21 May 09) we will celebrate the Ascension of our Lord into heaven at the right hand of His Father. Yet His promise that "*I am with you always until the end of the age*" remains in effect. The Lord Jesus who ascended is the same Lord Jesus who is always with us. He is with us in body and blood in the Sacrament of the Altar – the Lord's Supper.

As such, the Lord's Altar is where we gather until that day when He comes again to raise all the dead and bring us at last into the life of the world to come. This is the place where heaven and earth intersect. It is the place where we commune with all the saints including those in heaven. As such, Selma and Irma will be there also. And for that matter, so will all our beloved members who have gone before us.

So, I will see you in heaven this Sunday in the Lord's Supper.

From the Parish Nurse ~

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
May is Better Sleep Month. Anyone who has had trouble getting to sleep or waking up during the night knows that lack of sleep can affect them mentally and physically the next day. These are some suggestions in getting "better sleep".

1. Have a sleep schedule. Go to bed and get up at the same time everyday. This includes weekends. Irregular sleeping times will interfere with your biological clock. 7 to 9 hours of sleep per night is usually right for most people.
2. Be careful of what you eat or drink before going to bed. Wait three hours after dinner before going to sleep, especially after a heavy meal. Effects of caffeine last for about 8 hours. Avoid fluids for one hour before going to bed. An empty stomach may also interfere with sleep patterns. Foods with high levels of tryptophan such as milk, turkey, yogurt, ice cream, or peanuts help the body produce serotonin which promotes relaxation.
3. Keep the room dark.
4. Your sleeping position can contribute to sleeping well. Have a pillow that keeps your head and neck straight. Place a pillow between your knees if you sleep on your side or under your knees if you sleep on your back.
5. Maintain your mattress. Turn the mattress every few months. Replace it after 5-7 years of regular use.
6. Exercise during the day but not right before going to bed.
7. Don't nap more than 30 minutes during the day.
8. Wear appropriate clothing for the weather. Wear socks to bed or have an extra blanket by the bed during cold weather. Take a warm shower or bath before going to bed or put nightwear in the dryer to warm them. During warm weather, use a light blanket and don't drink hot fluids before going to bed.
9. If you sleep with the TV or music on, set the timer so make sure it goes off by the time you fall asleep.

See your health care provider if you have sleep disorders such as insomnia, obstructive sleep apnea, restless leg syndrome, narcolepsy, or symptoms of heartburn. May God provide you with the sleep and rest you need each day.

LWML exceeds mission goal for 2007-09 biennium

The LWML has exceeded its 2007-09 mission goal of \$1.7 million by \$75,730.17, according to President Janice Wendorf. "In the midst of these uncertain times, God's people have responded and supported the mission goal of the LWML for the 2007-09 biennium," Wendorf said. "Thanks to all the districts and individuals who have sent special offerings and gifts." Among contributions received by the March 31 deadline was an anonymous "memorial" gift of \$100,000. Funds for the mission goal come from the LWML's 40 districts, which receive "mite box" and other contributions from members, and pass along one-fourth of those monies to the national LWML for distribution to mission projects worldwide. LWML districts use 75% of what they receive for local mission-related projects. Although final reports are not yet available, the auxiliary's 250,000 members nationwide have likely raised a total of more than \$6.5 million during the 2007-09 biennium, according to the LWML office in St. Louis. The next LWML convention, June 25-28 in Portland OR, will adopt a new mission goal for the 2009-11 biennium and choose new projects to receive funding. This month, our last before the convention, let us lift up in prayer the Host Committee and Convention Programming Committee as they finalize all the details for the June 25-28 gathering. Let us pray for the LWML President Jan Wendorf as she prepares to chair the convention and for the speakers and proclaimers. Let us pray that each of our hearts will be open to new experiences and friendships. As final preparations are made, we give thanks for the opportunities this convention presents for each attendee.

Statement re: Iowa Supreme Court Ruling on Same-Sex "Marriage"

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings in the name of our Crucified and Risen Savior, Jesus, this Holy week.

Like many of you, we were saddened and offended by Iowa Supreme Court ruling regarding "same sex marriage" and the response of the leaders of the Iowa Legislature ruling out any effort to overturn the decision or even discuss it.

Today there are voices telling us that we must learn to "accept" the changes that are taking place in society. The reality is, society no longer values the church's role, is suspicious of our views, and considers us irrelevant. Society has lost its moral foundation upon which to base any decisions regarding true and false, good and evil, right and wrong.

As Lutheran Christians we have a duty and an unprecedented opportunity to speak to society the will of God as revealed to us in His Holy Word for this is the only solid foundation upon which a civilized society can stand. The Law of God declares that homophile behavior is intrinsically sinful (Lev. 18:22; 20:13; Rom.1:24-27). The Gospel declares that Jesus Christ is the atoning sacrifice for the sins of the world (1 John 2:2) and that Christ, who knew no sin, was made to be our sin so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God (2 Cor. 5:21). The church's proper evangelical work is to proclaim the reconciliation of the sinner to God in the death of Jesus Christ (2 Cor. 5:18-19).

Therefore, we cannot be silent regarding the Supreme Court's ruling, but must faithfully and publicly speak against it. For we are "a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that 'we' may declare the praises of him who called 'us' out of darkness into his wonderful light." I Peter 2:9

We will continue to define marriage as God has, "a lifelong union of one man and one woman." We will celebrate His gift to us and defend marriage as Martin Luther reminds us in his

explanation of the sixth commandment, "*We* should fear and love God so that *we* lead a sexually pure and decent life in what *we* say and do, and husband and wife love and honor each other."

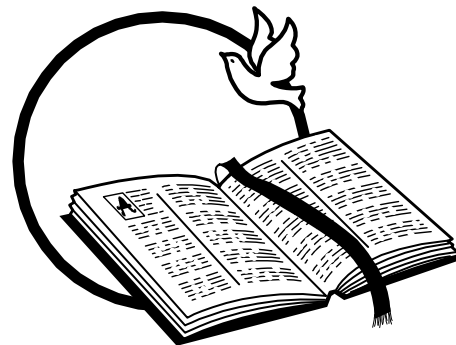
